U4 VISIT TO THE HOLOCAUST EDUCATION CENTRE



On Thursday, 24 June Upper 4 visited the Beth Shalom Holocaust Education Centre at Laxton, near Newark, Nottinghamshire. The girls listened to a Holocaust survivor tell of his experiences as a Jewish boy in Holland during the Second World War. Steven Frank related how his father died in a concentration camp and how his mother managed to help him and his brothers survive the Nazi camps and come to England after liberation.

The girls then toured the Holocaust Exhibition, and had an opportunity to visit the Memorial Gardens, which contained memorials to the millions of victims of the Nazi concentration camps. Some of the girls said afterwards what a

profound impression the experience had made on them. The girls were accompanied by Rev Jan, Mrs Chestnutt, and Mr Gill. *(By Mr Gill)*
