This policy applies to the Harrogate Ladies' College family of schools – Highfield Pre School, Highfield and College - hereafter referred to as "the School".

The School offers scholarships for girls from the UK and overseas joining Upper 3, Lower 5 and Lower 6 (special arrangements will be made for candidates applying from overseas). Internal candidates may also apply for scholarships in Lower 5 and Lower 6 during Upper 4 and Upper 5 respectively.

What is a Scholar?

Scholars are pupils who demonstrate a passion for and excellence in their chosen field whether it be Academics, Art, Drama, Music, Choral, Textiles or Sport. At any one time in Harrogate Ladies' College there will also be a few 'College Scholars' which are awards of 110% of fees given to means tested pupils from the North Yorkshire area who show exceptional academic ability and display the qualities of an Academic Scholar as outlined here.

Scholars love to learn and love to encourage others to learn and develop; their energy inspires others and their curiosity helps to build the whole exciting learning community of HLC. Scholars can be Day or Boarding pupils.

Our aim is to give each girl the encouragement, support and guidance she needs to be the best she can be. We do not want our scholars to feel that they must always achieve full marks, but we do expect them to try their best and apply themselves enthusiastically to school life. Our scholars should be role models, leading by example in a conscientious approach to their work and a willingness to help others who may be less obviously successful. Scholars in practical subjects (Art, Drama, Music, Choral, Textiles or Sport) are expected to participate fully in the extra-curricular programme of the department.

What is a Scholarship?

Scholarships are awarded as recognition of excellent previous achievement and potential for further successful development. The value of an Academic Scholarship is 5% of Day fees. The value of an Art, Drama, Music, Choral, Textiles or Sport Scholarship is 5% of Day fees. Candidates can only apply for **two** Scholarships each and - if successful - will only be given **one.**

Scholarships are normally valid from September of the year of entry until the end of each Key Stage. However, scholars' progress is reviewed annually to ensure a level of sustained effort, commitment and achievement is being maintained.



Application Process

The list of current Scholars is held by the Principal's PA.

The management of the scholars is the responsibility of the Assistant Head (Teaching and Learning) and relevant Head of School who will monitor the progress of the scholar. Where a scholar is giving cause for concern this will be raised by her Head of School and steps taken to support the student. Where underperformance is consistent and help has been offered, this matter will be discussed with the Principal. The school reserves the right to withdraw the scholarship at the end of a Key Stage (or before in exceptional circumstances) if there is consistent poor performance. In this instance the pupil and parent would be alerted to this possibility in advance.

Criteria for success requires a combination of factors including those given below:

- Test results (including baseline data and school examinations)
- Nascent ability
- Academic tenacity and rigour
- Genuine academic curiosity
- Creative/ lateral thinking
- Passion for learning
- Awareness of wider world
- Desire to share excitement about learning with others

The Assistant Head (Teaching and Learning) in association with the Director of Marketing and Admissions and Heads of School arrange the process for Scholarship Assessment for all external candidates, and the Principal's PA for internal candidates:

- Arranging the Scholarship timetable and liaising with relevant staff
- Sending personalised letters to candidates to advise them of their Scholarship Assessment Programme
- Collating papers for Academic Scholarship Assessment
- Coordinating a feedback and decision making meeting
- The Principal liaises with families about the outcomes and the Principal's decision is final. Written feedback is offered to all candidates.
